FOREWORD

Alton is my town, I am proud of it's heritage and the pioneers who settled here. Thus for the past three years I have traveled on every road, cow path, and roads that no longer exist, searching. I have talked to people, those that remember, and those who have walked the woods as I have.

The pages that follow represent hours of typing and research, in hopes of accurately preserving forever those men and women who homesteaded our town. A lonely cemetery, overgrown and forgotten, distant in the deep woods, to me is a tragedy and an insult to those who made Alton the town we now know and enjoy. For this reason I have tried to record a permanent record of all those who have pioneered and established the town; to locate and identify the final resting place of those who fought in the service of our Country and our State, over the past two hundred years; to permanently preserve for future generations and historians, burial grounds which otherwise would have been lost with time, some I found are now in this condition.

I have recorded ninety-seven graveyards in the town of Alton, of these many were hard to find and when found were hardly visible because of neglect. I also recorded names of Alton people buried in out-of-town graveyards. These were from Gilmanton, Barnstead, Wolfeboro, New Durham, Gilford, fourteen of these are listed in the following text.

Few people knew or cared where they were or what they looked like, except a few who went with me and showed me their location. These people and others were of great help with the genealogy of those buried in our old as well as our new graveyards.

For the Residents of Alton who have lived here or are living here, these are the records of all who have passed here before us, so as you may know who were the inhabitants of our town.

I sincerely hope it may help many relatives and friends, find those forgotten or otherwise lost and not knowing where they now rest.

These records are as accurate as I could establish, some stones are unreadable and many are missing completely.

I would gladly include or change any of these records if anyone would let me know of their whereabouts.

In the winter of 1977 and 1978, myself and two others cut off all the cemeteries which were overgrown with brush and trees. We worked for four months and finished forty-seven. The cleaning up is supposed to be done this year of 1978.

This project started in April of 1975 and after three years and one month was completed on May 14, 1978.




SOUTH ALTON

The first settlements in the Town were on the ridges of South Alton. The Chamberlain brothers were near the apex of the Alton-New Durham-Barnstead line, Timothy Davis and Zebulon Davis and Nichlos Glidden were high on the Mount Prospect Road, Gideon Davis on the Stockbridge Corners Road next to New Durham, and the Glidden Brothers; John, Richard and Robert on Coffin Ridge, all arriving about the same time . . 1770.

For the next 75 years the families of South Alton were the most prosperous and influential throughout the township. Thirty six cemeteries hold the remains of these early settlers and their descendants as well as several burial grounds in adjacent communities.

These proud inhabitants gave many things to the town. Nine Veterans of the Revolution, eight early Ministers, a General in the New Hampshire Militia, a Representative to the U. S. Congress, the first Church and Meeting House, the first licensed Tavern, and even the name ALTON. The inventor of the cork-screw and paper clip was a descendent from one of the early families. The builder of the first decked vessel on the "Big Lake" was an original settler.

Two hundred fifty yards, due north on wall, from highest point of road on Prospect Mtn. Road.

Revolutionary War Soldier Comrade-in-Arms and brother-in-law to Isreal Stockbridge. Zebulon came to Alton from Rochester in 1782. Tanner and cordwainer by profession, he also ran a stage stop and tavern through the early 1800's with his son Stephen.

-- TIMOTHY DAVIS --

Two hundred yards, due north from Prospect Road, due south from highest point of Mt. Prospect. In the open with a few stones scattered over an area of 30' by 30'.

Two successive years of early and late frost in the lowlands of New Durham discouraged Timothy Davis. In 1772 he sold his two farms in New Durham and purchased land high on the crest of Mt. Prospect, and resigned as Selectman of New Durham. Timothy is buried with others of his family in a small cemetery clinging to a gentle slope of the mountain. His headstone, only a fieldstone is behind his house where the first Town Meeting of ALTON was held on MARCH 5, 1777.

S-P-10 -- PROSPECT MTN. CEMETERY --

Unfortunately and sadly, so many early settlers and pioneers were laid to rest marked only by a crude fieldstone. Too poor to afford anything better, they remain known only to their maker. Here there are only nine stones.

This cemetery lies silent marked only by a wavering line of crude stones. A tragic symbol of men whose lives went unnoticed and forgotten.

This lies west of the Africa Road on the Mtn. Road on the south side of the road, 75 feet from it, empty now.

A vain man who dissipated his father's riches, (Eleazer Davis), once owned Rattlesnake Island. It is spoken in whispers through the hills of South Alton that he beat his sixteen year old Daughter so badly that she died three days later.

Six tenths of a mile in a westerly direction from intersection of Rte. 28 and Prospect Mtn. Road, stone wall enclosed, many graves but only a few stones left.

At Gammons Corner proceed north about one quarter mile to the first cemetery which is Daniel's and is located on the east-erly side of the road. One mile further on same side is Stephen's.

The two brothers Stephen and Daniel, owned large tracts of land in the southern part of the town. They and descendants prospered for several generations as farmers. Both Stephen and Daniel fought in the Revolution, arriving in Alton about 1790.

This is a large monument with names on four sides facing to four points of the compass.

He was a Millerite and was going from house to house advising his brethren and sisters to stand fast in the belief and having no doubt that he should see Christ coming in the Clouds of Heaven.

Here lies at rest the only accountable Stockbridges, descendants of Isreal. The graves of the others are perhaps lost forever. The only males are John and his sons Shadrack and Abednego. Shadrack for many years in the 1800's kept a store and tavern at Stockbridge Corners - it is after him we got the name Stockbridge Corner and Stockbridge Road.

-- GILMANTON --

The three principal cemeteries of Gilmanton, unlike Alton, are located close to a Church. The oldest and largest burial grounds located adjacent to the Smith Meeting House. First erected in 1774, it was Congregationalist in denomination. Several Alton residents are buried here. Almost as old is the cemetery outside the Iron Works on Route 140, opposite the site where the Free Will Baptist Church once stood. Organized in 1780, the Baptist erected their meeting house prior to 1800. Many early and prominent South Alton people were buried here, probably because the "Mother Church" on New Durham Ridge has no Church graveyard. Several inhabitants of the Gore section of Alton are buried in the newer Pine Grove Cemetery.


EAST ALTON

A region of rolling hills, fertile land, and streams that were large enough to turn mill wheels, East Alton was for many years, one of the most prosperous sections of the Town. Fiercely independent and somewhat isolated from the rest of Alton was something of a Township in itself, with it's Church wielding tremendous influence of the day-by-day lives of its inhabitants.

The first settlers, Stephen Fall and Moses Dow built their log cabins on the shores of the Lake about 1780. However, the first settler to have an impact on the area was Jonathan Leighton, who about 1785, built his mill at the outlet of Gilman Pond. The remains can be seen today above and below where the Gilman Corners Road crosses the brook. Following Leighton, the next settlers were from the south, New Durham and Rochester, names were prominent for generations, the McDuffees, Drews, and Whitehouses.

About the turn of the century, as in West Alton, the sons of the original settlers from South Alton began arriving, most settling on land their fathers had purchased for them. It would be these men, and their descendants who would guide the destiny of East Alton for the next century. The names are familiar, - Gilman, Glidden, Roberts, Stockbridge, and Flanders.

Unlike much of the other parts of Town, many of the old houses still stand, in their beautiful rural setting, much as they did one hundred fifty years ago.



WEST ALTON

One of the last areas to be settled. West Alton's first pioneers, sons of the last settlers in Alton, the Gliddens and Flanders . . . homesteaded along the Alton/Gilford line near Route 11A about 1800. The small community that grew up in this area was prosperous enough to support two school houses. About one hundred years ago the settlement began to fade away as the residents moved to the cities, particularly Laconia. Today only one dwelling still remains, built over one hundred sixty years ago.

The stretch of land bordering the Lake along Route 11 wasn't seriously settled until about 1825. From then on it grew rapidly, soon boasting it's own Church, Post Office, store, and Inn. Much of the growth was attributed to the fact that the region was traversed by the heavily travelled Alton-Meredith Road (Route 11). With the advent of the railroad connecting Lake Village (Lakeport) and Dover via Alton Bay in the 1850's the area found it's true destiny - the summer vacationer.


ALTON MOUNTAIN

Settlement began in this area about 1785 when Doctor Jonathan Hill of Gilmanton purchased land and built a farm which still stands near the pond which today still bears his name. The first families to pioneer "Lake District" of Alton Mountain were residents of Gilmanton in particular, the Cloughs.

Simon Clough built one of the first saw mills in the Town of Alton, and in its time one of the largest, this was at the outlet of Sunset Lake. The Clough Mill shortly afterwards passed into the hands of Enoch Small and the body of water that turns the huge Mill wheel was known as Small's Pond. Again the mill changed hands and again the pond changed names to that of the owner, Jacob Place. Place's Pond is now known as Sunset Lake.

The large cemetery on the Mountain Road holds the remains of the early settlers of the region, including Veterans of the Revolution, War of 1812, and the Civil War. Nehemiah Sleeper, who once owned and gave his name to Sleeper's Island is buried here.

By the late 1800's the remoteness of the area, the decline and lack of timber, as well as the marginal fertility of the land led to the abandonment of Alton Mountain. Once prosperous farms soon rotted away or burned never to be replaced. One was moved by Railroad to Rochester. Today only five houses built over one hundred and fifty years ago still stand.


