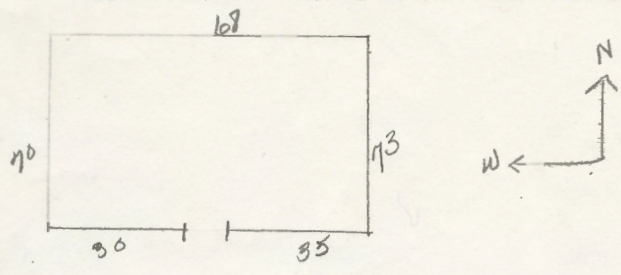

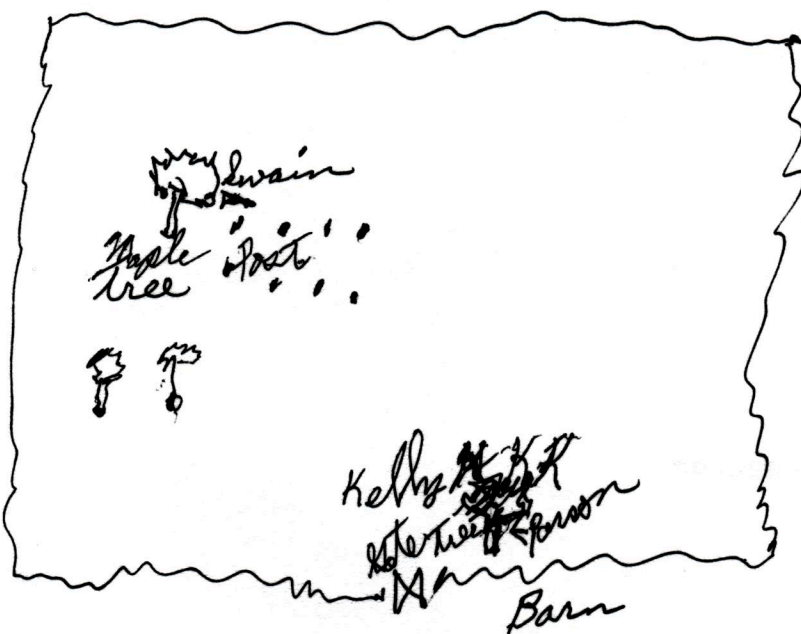

Bosiak, Sr.**, married, with a mailing address of RR#3, Box 825, Upper City Road, Pittsfield, New Hampshire, 03263 (the "Grantee"), with **QUITCLAIM COVENANTS**, a certain tract or parcel of land, situated on Old Wilson Hill Road, in Gilmanton, Belknap County, New Hampshire as described in the plan entitled "Tax Map Lot 65-01-00 Subdivision Plan for Frank C. Bosiak, Wilson Hill Road, Belknap County, Gilmanton, New Hampshire", dated June 26, 1995 and recorded in the Belknap County Registry of Deeds on near or even date herewith, (hereinafter "Subdivision Plan") bounded and described as follows:

Also granting to Frank C. Bosiak, Sr., his heirs, successors and assigns a non-exclusive fifty foot (50') wide right-of-way easement for the benefit of the land of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr. to pass and repass for all lawful purposes, including, but not limited to, access by livestock and equipment, over a portion of the 49 acre parcel of Joseph Bosiak. Said Easement shall be non-exclusive and shall be appurtenant to and run with the land of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr., in perpetuity, and is described more fully in the Subdivision Plan bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point labelled "D" on said Subdivision Plan along the boundary line between land of Joseph Bosiak and land of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr.; thence

S 60° 43' 23" W, a distance of 23.69 feet, more or less, along the stone wall of other land of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr.; thence

S 61° 03' 43" W, a distance of 66.83 feet, more or less, along the stone wall of other land of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr. to a point labelled "C" on the Subdivision Plan marked by a drill hole set; thence

N 34° 14' 36" W, a distance of 4.51 feet, more or less, along the other land of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr.; thence

N 34° 14' 29" W, a distance of 45.70 feet more or less, along the other land of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr. to the point labelled "D" on the Subdivision Plan at the point of beginning (the "Easement").

Any access by Joseph Bosiak, his heirs, agents, successors or assigns shall not interfere, obstruct, restrict, or prohibit in anyway the full right to pass and repass of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr. or his heirs, agents, successors or assigns through the entire easement area.


Frank C. Bosiak, Sr., his heirs, agents, successors or assigns shall maintain a fence along the boundary line of the easement area described above to prevent cattle from entering the land now or formally of Joseph Bosiak. Frank C. Bosiak, Sr. will construct fence gates made of the same fencing materials. Said gates to be approximately fifteen (15) feet, more or less, in width at or just easterly of said point labeled "D" on said Plan and at or just westerly of said point labeled "F" on said Plan. By accepting and recording this deed Frank C. Bosiak, Sr. for himself, his heirs, agents, successors and assigns, agrees to be bound by and perform the tasks set forth in this paragraph. Any such acceptance shall not constitute a right of re-entry for condition broken nor shall it be a condition subsequent to the grant of easement.


Joseph Bosiak, his heirs, agents, successors and assigns shall maintain said gates referenced above. Joseph Bosiak, his heirs, agents, successors, and assigns may access the easement area without interfering with the use of the Easement by Frank C. Bosiak, Sr., his heirs, agents, successors and assigns. Access by Joseph Bosiak, his heirs, agents, successors and assigns into the Easement Area shall not interfere with the integrity of the fence or gates surrounding the easement area so that livestock will not enter the land of Joseph Bosiak.

MEANING AND INTENDING to convey to Frank C. Bosiak, Sr., the Premises described above in order to correct the Plan previously recorded in the Belknap County Registry of Deeds as Plan L19-98. For other title references refer to the Notice of Decision dated July 5, 1995 by the Belknap County Superior Court approving the Stipulation of Settlement In Re: E-90-305 Bosiak v. Bosiak, and the Court Decree partitioning the property formerly of Frank C. Bosiak, Sr. and Joseph Bosiak recorded in the Belknap County Registry of Deeds at Book 1243, Page 214.

This is not homestead property of the Grantor.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

THAT, THE FEDERAL LAND BANK OF SPRINGFIELD, a corporation established under the laws of the United States of America, pursuant to an Act of Congress, known as the Federal Farm Loan Act, approved July 17, 1916, and having its office and principal place of business in the City of Springfield, County of Hampden and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of TEN AND MORE DOLLARS and other good and valuable consideration to it in hand before the delivery hereof well and truly paid by Ruth Hobard Montgomery of the city of New York County of New York and state of New York, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, convey, and confirm unto the said Ruth Hobard Montgomery, her heirs and assigns forever:

Three (3) certain tracts, pieces, or parcels of land, with the buildings and improvements thereon erected, situate in the Counties of Belknap and Merrimack, in the State of New Hampshire, and more particularly bounded and described as follows, to wit:

PARCEL 1

Two hundred (200) acres, more or less, in the Town of Gilmanton, situate west of the Concord-Gilmanton Iron Works Road, beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the westerly line of property of Martha Martin and the Concord Gilmanton Iron Works Road, running thence westwardly along the said road to the intersection of the same with an old highway; thence northwestwardly along said highway to a point formed by the intersection of the same, with the easterly line of lands of Lincoln Osgood; thence northwardly along the easterly side of said Osgood's lands; thence eastwardly along the southerly side of land of Frank Egerly; thence in a southerly direction along said land of Frank Egerly; thence still along said Egerly's land in a southeasterly direction to the northwesterly boundary of lands of Charles Kelley; thence in a southeasterly direction along said Kelley's land to land of Martha Martin; thence along the boundary of said Martha Martin's land in a general southerly direction to the Concord Road, the point or place of beginning.

PARCEL 2

Five hundred five (505) acres, more or less, in the Towns of Gilmanton, Loudon and Barnstead, situate on both sides of the Pittsfield-Gilmanton Road, and beginning at a point where the easterly side of lands now or formerly of Lucy Gritz, continued in a northerly direction, meets Hollin's Pond, and thence proceeding from said Hollin's Pond eastwardly around the parcel, hereby intended to be conveyed, as follows: along the southerly side of Hollin's Pond and the southerly boundary of lands of Kelley Brothers

to the Pittsfield-Gilmanton Road; thence northerly along said road and the easterly boundary of said land of Kelley Brothers and land of Martha Martin to land of William Webster; thence across said road eastwardly along the southerly boundary of land of William Ashcroft; thence northwardly along the Easterly boundary of said Ashcroft's land; thence eastwardly along the southerly boundaries of lands of Charles Kelley and Martha Martin; thence in a southwesterly direction along the westerly boundary of lands of Alice Morgan across a brook; thence eastwardly along the southerly boundary of said Alice Morgan's lands; thence northwardly along the easterly boundary of said Alice Morgan's lands to a point where the same meets the aforesaid brook; thence in an eastwardly direction along said brook along the southerly boundary of lands of Willard Mardin and David Barton; thence northwardly along the easterly boundary of said land of David Barton to the Province Road; thence easterly along the Province Road to the Barnstead-Gilmanton Town Line; thence southwestwardly along said town line to the aforesaid brook; thence in an easterly direction along the aforesaid brook and southerly boundary of lands of Austin Warfield to the westerly boundary of lands of J. E. Eastman; thence in a southwestwardly direction along the northwesterly boundary of said land of J.E. Eastman; thence in a southeastwardly direction along the southwestery boundary of said land of said J. E. Eastman; thence in a southwestwardly direction along the northwesterly boundary of lands of Herbert Dustin; thence northwestwardly along the northerly boundary of lands of F. G. Osborne and Clifton French to the Pittsfield-Gilmanton Road; thence southwardly along said road and crossing the Gilmanton-Louden Town line to land of A. E. Kelley; thence westwardly along the northerly boundary of land of A. E. Kelley; thence northwardly along the easterly boundary of land of Clifton French; and again crossing said Gilmanton-Louden town line; thence westwardly along the northerly boundary of said French's land; and thence northwardly along the easterly boundaries of lands of Bela Merrill and Lucy Gritz to Rollin's Pond, the point or place of beginning.

PARCEL 3

Three (3) acres, more or less in the Town of Gilmanton situate on the northwesterly edge of Rollin's Pond and bounded southeasterly by said Rollin's Pond, easterly by lands of William Webster, northerly by Concord Gilmanton Road as the same winds, and westerly by land of Lucy Gritz.

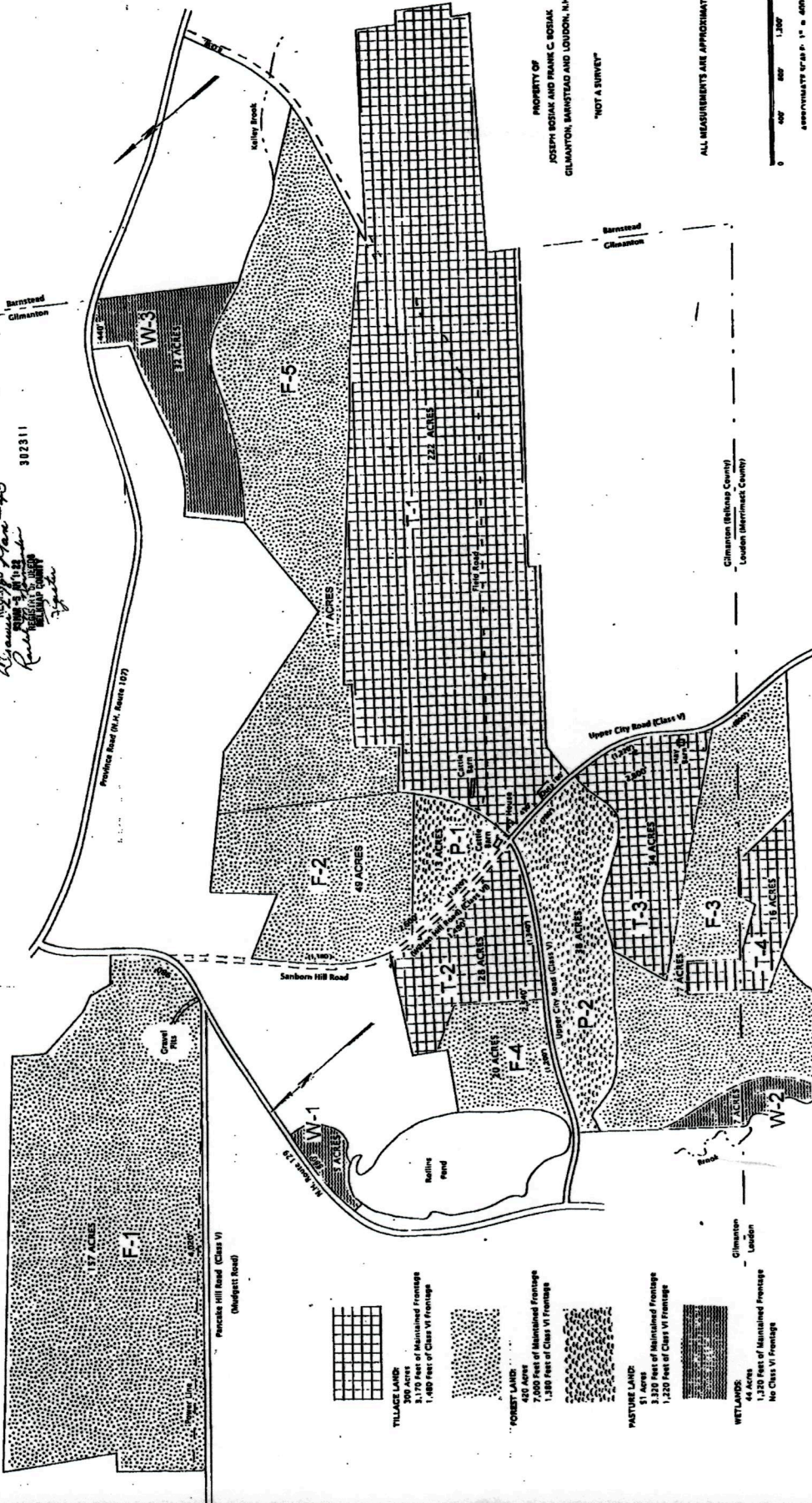

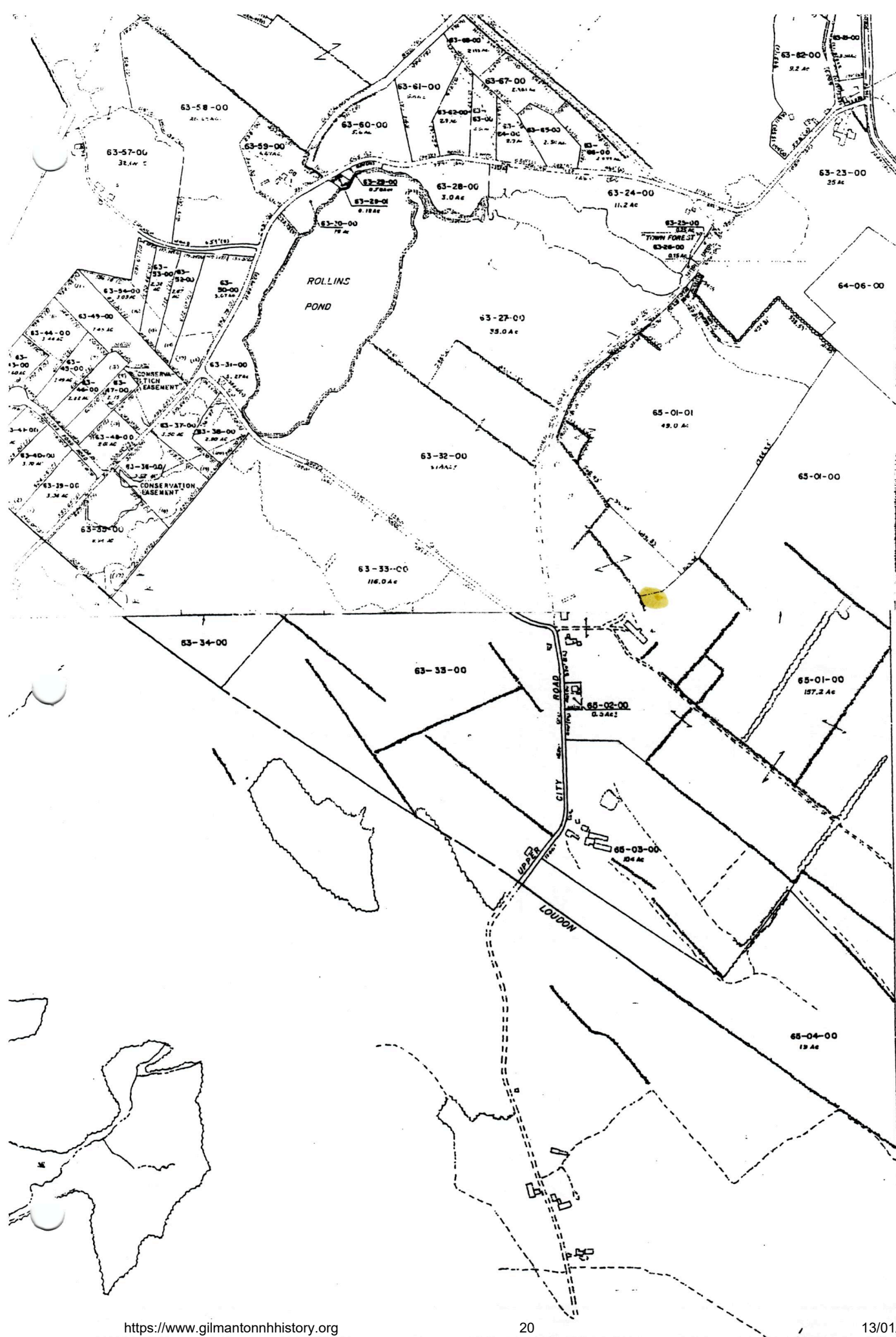
