Parking for the Joe Urner Trail is seasonally available adjacent to the Tom Howe Barn at 245 Meeting House Road.

The trail follows the eastern edge of the hay field, past the Tom Howe Retting Pond, entering the woods soon after. After passing by some old farm tools, the trail splits into a loop. Heading clockwise, a spur departs to the edge of the hay field, while the main trail continues to a ledge on the shore of Meetinghouse Pond. Continuing on, a private trail departs left (no access) while the main trail returns to the junction.
