Good morning Marion - I was able to go to Barnstead last Sunday and met with my brothers cousin, Leanord Smith. He and his wife were very helpful and they took my to see the farm of Edward Ham. After seeing the farm and the area, I don't think this is where my mother took me to see the cemetery. I am wondering if there is a graveyard near the Clarke farm in Barnstead (not the Yelle farm, but the one where there is a pond on the property). Smitty called Tink Merrill(?) but he didn't know either.

Do you have any idea where William Ham and Anna Meader are buried. They both died in Gilmanton, William in 1843 and Anna June 12, 1840. Their son Rev Ezra Ham and his wife, Mercy Hill, are buried at the Meeting House cemetery in Gilmanton. I am putting together documentation of the Ham, Hill, Wiggin, Clarke, Littlefield, etc etc etc lines for my family and trying to get as many photo's of gravesites as possible. I am planning on another trip to Barnstead, hopefully the weekend of the 22nd of Oct.

Marion - This is what I remember and mind you this was close to thirty years ago, so my memory could be totally off here. Ed Ham was my mother's uncle and she used to live in Barnstead and Gilmanton. My grandfather, Henry Ham, was Ed's brother.

All I remember is visiting this small very well kept cemetery with what I thought at the time, was a lot of stones. There was a low stone wall surrounding the cemetery. It was probably a farm cemetery for the Ham family. I believe the stones I am interested in (William Ham and Anna Meader) were located in the upper left hand corner. Right next to the cemetery was a two story farmhouse that looked like it could have been built in the 1700's. I can't remember if it was for sale or not, but I do remember looking at it and thinking it would be great if I could buy it and move up here. The reason I remember the stones so well, is that William Ham was born May 8, 1757 and I remember thinking our birthdays were only a day apart from each other. Funny how things stick in your mind. Can you tell me what street or road Ed Ham's farm is located on?

I am planning on visiting Barnstead and Gilmanton on Sunday Oct 9th. My half-brother's cousin (Leonard Smith) (from Barnstead) is going to meet me and take me around to some of the various burying grounds and I would like to see if I can find this one. Dear Marion,

Both Bob and I read your letter and neither of us has any recollection of a cemetery anywhere across the road from the farm we owned. We both did a lot of hunting and exploring on our property when we were there and doubt there was ever a cemetery as Mrs. Thayer described. The Ushers owned some land below the farm on both sides of the road, and there was a good sized camp-type building on the opposite side of the road from the little cape which was torn down during our time there. Also, where Osmon's built, there was an old cellar hole, but we never came across a cemetery in that area. And, of course, the Kingsbury property bordered ours on field side of the road heading toward Smith Meeting House Rd. And, I remember being told that one of the Kingsbury buildings was originally an old store, maybe a stage road? There was, maybe still is, a clump of trees in the field in front of Kingsbury's house that might possibly have been a small cemetery; we seem to recall quite a number of rocks there, and it may be in line with the farm house? When we moved there, in an area below the field across from our house there was quite an open area, and I explored it extensively, 'cause it had the most wonderful high blueberry bushes where I picked often. I know it has since all grown up with thick bushes.

From various past conversations we had with Sybil, John Page (the John who lived across from Little Bill Swain house), the Daigneaus and the Yosts, we recall that Mr. Ed Ham was a batch (never heard whether he had siblings) who owned around one thousand acres, mostly on the same side of the road as our farm, all the way up to and including the present McWhinnie property. Back in the mid-thirties Bob's dad, who farmed in Dover, used to pasture some of his cattle with Mr. Ham on that land now owned by McWhinnie.. There were large farm buildings at one time which the McWhinnie's tore down. Bob's dad also remember the Twomblys living in the little house up the road from our farm. You're probably aware that prior to our owning the farm, it was owned for a short time by an Arthur Plant and before that by a family named Woodard, and also sometime after Mr. Ham, it was owned by Gilmans. Sorry not to have been able to be more help much.

We wish you luck in your search; if you ever do solve the mystery, we would love to know.

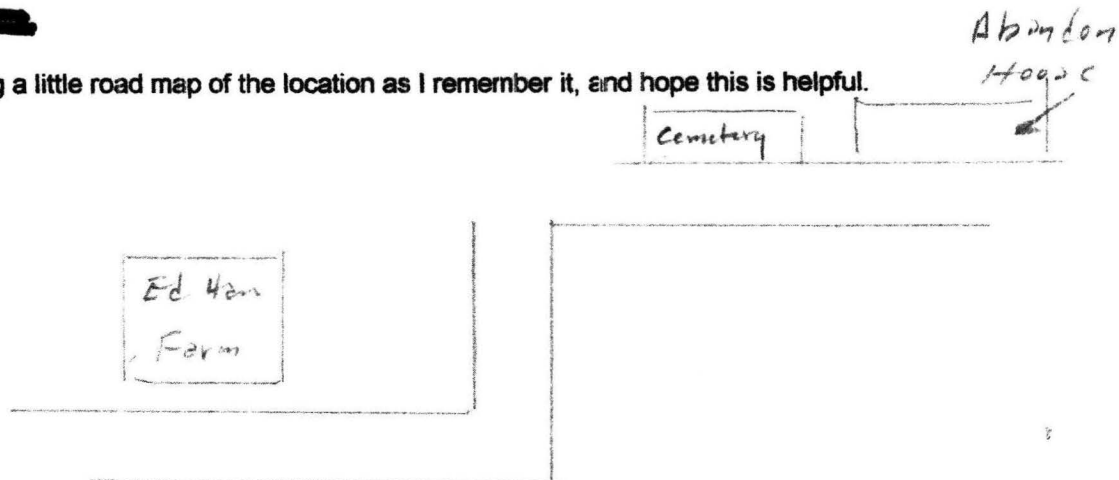
