March 30, 1830-1905.

(Written for the birthday of Henry L. and Harriet L. Hurd.)

Seventy-five years in Gilmanton,
Brother and sister journeying on,
Sometimes in ways that were dark and dreary,

On through this vale of smiles and tears,
On through the swiftly rolling years,
Under the Heavenly Father's care
Whose love and mercy are everywhere.

Loudon Ridge, in their infancy
Gave them welcome, but not to be
Permanent home of their childhood days;
Providence otherwise ordered their ways,
Guiding the steps of their parents on
Over the hills of Gilmanton;

Household goods and children small,
Henry and Harriet, cradle and all,
Pausing not till they set them down
By the eastern border of the town.

Near by is the Iron Works, where is wrought

No iron at all, save what is brought
From distant states to be forthwith
Wrought on the anvil and forge of the smith,
But here is the Suncook's dashing stream
Where waters bright from the mill wheels
gleam;

Here the farmers their logs would draw
To the slow, old-fashioned, upright saw:
And corn from many a neighboring hill
Was ground in the stones of the ancient mill.

Here on the farm which the "Beans" once tilled

This family soon was domiciled;
Here life-long labors and cares await,
Which only death can terminate,
Here also love's sweet recompense
And many gifts of Providence
Sustained them in those early days
And filled their hearts with joy and praise.

Promising girls and sprightly boys
Filled many a home with purest joys;
But search as you might on the hills around,
Happier father could not be found
Than Caleb Hurd when his work was done,
Sitting beside his own hearthstone,
Resting at night with his family,
The twins together upon his knee.

When years had passed two children more
Played together before that door,
James, who bears a grandfather's name
And Charles, the preacher, the last who came,
All were welcome, and each one sure
Of generous care and affection pure,
Strong of purpose and firm of will,
Useful places in life to fill;
Guarding the flag in many a battle,
Where cannons roar and muskets rattle
Or serving the town in civil station,
Honored citizens of the nation.

But the passing years have changed that scene
Of quiet joy and faith serene;
These parents' earthly work is done
And they to their well earned rest have gone,
Harriet clings to the early home
Choosing not afar to roam,
Keeping the farm and loving it well,
With feelings no stranger's tongue can tell,
While her brother, still in active life,
Braving courageously this world's strife
With consecrated heart and voice,
Dwells in the town of their parents' choice,
Directing his life to righteous ends,
Beloved and trusted by many friends.

And now as we greet these friends today,
For success to them we earnestly pray;
May Deacon Hurd, as the years go by
And time on rapid wings doth fly,
See his desire in this good town;
May heaven's blessing his labors crown,
May church and Sunday school so dear
Honor the Master year by year.
Loyally, patiently gathering in
The sheaves of good from the fields of sin.

Still may Harriet's quiet life,
Far from the world's commotion and strife,
Be nurtured by faith and strengthened by
prayer,
With courage the burdens of life to bear,
Honored by kindred, neighbor and friend,
May she be kept to the journey's end,
Leaving the precious memory
Of faith and hope and constancy.

And may this diamond jubilee
Leave them happily, quietly
Pursuing the way they long have trod,
With faith in friends and trust in God,
As they journey on in the shining way
That leads to glory and endless day;
And when this brother and sister true
Have finished the work they were given to do
