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## BRIEF SKETCH

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#### NOTE.

The compiler of the following sketches is aware of their incompleteness, and publishes them at this time merely to awaken a more general interest in the subject, in order that he may obtain fuller records for a future edition.

The arrangement of the material follows very closely the so-called "Register Plan," and is so simple as to require but little explanation. Each head of a family is given a number in the order of his descent. Thus, on page 7. we find 3. Jonathan [Timothy I (I)]; the figure 3 denoting the number of the paragraph; the exponent figure shows the generation; the name in italics being that of his father, and the figure in parentheses (I) the number of the paragraph containing particulars of the latter. An Arabic numeral placed before a name in list of children indicates the number of the paragraph containing particulars of that individual. Thus, on page 7, in list of Timothy's children, we read: 3 iv. Jonathan 2, etc., and find particulars of him in paragraph 3.

The signs and abbreviations being those commonly used, it seems unnecessary to enumerate them. The authority from which information has been derived is placed in parentheses.

Incomplete as the work may be, it has cost no little time and labor, and the compiler may add that in nearly every case where town records are quoted, the search was made personally, and every effort used to make the work free from mistakes.

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#### THE HUTCHINSON FAMILY.

IKE many families, we have the tradition concerning the "brothers," which is substantially as follows: Two brothers came to America about the time of the famous Ann Hutchinson's arrival (1634), one of whom soon returned to England, but the other, remaining, is said to have been the progenitor of our family. In following out the proof of the above, we have traced it to Jonathan Hutchinson, a grandson of Timothy, said Timothy being the earliest ancestor to whom we can trace, and this brings us to within two generations of the emigrant.

The claim has been made by many that we are connected with Gov. Hutchinson's family, and by others, with the famous Hutchinson singers; but a careful examination of the printed genealogies of those families shows that such is not the case.

The earliest date to which any of our name can trace is the year 1282, when Barnard Hutchinson was living in Cowlam, Yorkshire, England, where begins the main stock of the family. Tradition, however, carries us back to the year 1066 to one Uitonensis, a Norwegian, and one of the followers of Harold Harfager, King of Norway, who was then invading England and was defeated at Stamford Bridge. This Uitonensis was among the Norwegians who remained in England and settled at a place called Bishop Middleham, near the city of York.

Many have made inquiries concerning coat-armor, but of course we can make no claim to anything of this nature until we are able to trace to our emigrant ancestor and his former nome in England, and even then it is doubtful if we find him connected with the heraldic families of that time, for it must be remembered that but a very small proportion of the early settlers were entitled to bear arms, the main portion belonging to the sturdy class of yeomanry.

Timothy¹ Hutchinson is the earliest ancestor to whom we are now able to trace; he was residing in Hampton Falls, N. H., in 1710, as appears by a petition of the inhabitants of

that precinct, asking to be set off as a separate town\*, the petition bearing date 13 May of that year (N. H. State Papers. ii. 429). The earliest record of land purchased by him we find under date 13 Nov. 1718, when he bought of Ebenezer Lovell for £24 "a certain parcel of land situate lying in ye township of Hampton--laid out in ye first West division being three half shares in number ve one hundred fifty three 154 & one hundred fifty nine -- bounded to ye quarter of a mile of common on ye East a highway at both ends and a lot of land formerly of Henry Davis on the West" (Rockingham Co. Rec. Deeds. vol. 54, p. 497). This land was in that part of Hampton now known as Kensingtont and was his homestead (see account of his son Jonathan). From the N. H. State Papers we learn the following facts: Timothy Huchesen among the inhabitants of Hampton Falls who, in 1732-3, petition that a certain house may be licensed "to entertain travellers" (ix. 342), also among those opposed to the formation of a new parish (ix. 348). In 1739 he appears among the inhabitants of Kensington who petition for annexation to Massachusetts\* (ix. 355). In 1746-7 he signs, with others of Kensington, a remonstrance against the building of a certain bridge (ix. In Kensington town records, under date S Nov. 1737, 5S3). is recorded an agreement concerning the boundary line between his estate and that of James Sanborn. In 1745 he was a witness in the case of one Philemon Blake, who was accused of having built a fence "encroaching on y" King's Highway, being an encumbrance and offence to His Majesty's peace, crown and dignity." The date of his death is unknown, but he was alive as late as 1759, in which year he deeds the homestead to his son Jonathan. His wife Hannah was baptized and admitted to the Hampton Falls church 14 July 1717, and her death is thus recorded in the church records of Kensington:

1752. Nov. 21. Hannah wife of Timothy Hutchins died Aged 70.

2.EBENEZER<sup>2</sup> [ Timothv<sup>1</sup> (1)] resided first in Kensington, where he signed petition in 1730 for annexation to Massachusetts (N. H. State Papers, ix. 355). In 1741 he was in Exeter, N. H., and among those who petitioned for parish privileges (Ibid. ix. 559), and in 1743 he was in Brentwood (Ibid. ix. 77). Was a member of the Exeter company in the Crown Point expedition of 1755 (Bell's Hist. Exeter, p 233) and also in 1757 (Adjt. Gen'l. Report. ii. 187). He m. in Kensington, 2 Nov. 1738, Elizabeth Marsh (Chh. Rec.) The following is a copy of the Chh. Rec. of Kingston:

Joseph Seecomb baptized Ebenezer Hutcheson adult & his children,

Henry Theophilus & John. Oct. 12, 1746.

August 7, 1748, baptized Joseph son of Ebenezer Hutchinson.

Rev. James Cushing baptized Lizza daughter of Ebenezer Hutcheson Oct. 15, 1752.

JONATHAN<sup>2</sup> [Timothy<sup>1</sup> (1)] was a tanner by trade, though 3. in one deed we have found him called "cordwainer" (shoemaker). He resided in Kensington on the opposite side of the road from the three half shares purchased by his father in 1718. On 15 Feb. 1759 he purchased these three half shares of his father and in the deed the place is called the "homestead." In 1760 he was a grand juror and in 1761 sold his farm to Richard Sanborn, Jr., and probably removed to Kingston, for in July of that year his son Levi was baptized there. Some time in 1761 he removed to Canterbury, as appears by several deeds. In one dated 27 Feb. 1764 his residence is given as Kingston and in one dated 17 Oct. following he is of Canterbury. In 1768 he appears in Gilmanton, coming from Loudon, then a part of Canterbury. (Lancaster's Hist. Gilmanton p. 273.) His name appears among those of Gilmanton who sign the Association Test Paper (N. H. State Papers, viii. 234), but we fail to find that he took an active part in the war. His

intention of marriage is recorded as follows in the records of Salisbury, Mass.:

Jonathan Hutchinson of Kensington entered his intention of marriage with Theodate Morrill of Salisbury Novembr 6: 1742.

He was m. in Salisbury 13 Jan. 1743. Theodate was the daughter of Aaron and Joanna Morrill, b. in Salisbury 24 Nov. 1726, and descended from Abraham Morrill, one of the early settlers of Salisbury. Jonathan d. in Gilmanton, N. H., 5 Aug. 1801. Children:

Elisha Hutchenson son of Jonathan Hutchenson by Theodate his wife was born August ye 3d 1744.

He resided in Louden and took an active part in the Revolution, his service being as follows:\* Enlisted 7 May 1775 in Capt. Dearborn's company, and was at Bunker Hill; in 1776 he joined Capt. Moody's company, Col. Baldwin's regiment, to reinforce the army in New York; sergeant in Capt. Nathaniel Wilson's company. Col. Stickney's regiment, Gen. Stark's brigade at Bennington, having enlisted 22 July 1777; in April 1778 he joined Capt Amos Merrill's company, Col. Stark's regiment of the Regular Army, and in 1780-1 he was a member of the 2d company, Col. Cilley's regiment of N. H. line. The following list of children is given in Hist. Gilmanton, but we are unable to learn anything further of his family:—
