I did email him with my inquiry and provided him what information I had on my ancestor, Jonathan Prescott (III) a recognized Patriot in the American Revolution from Kensington, NH and moved to Gilmanton, NH. Hi Candace,

I wish to thank you and the other Cemetery Trustees of Gilmanton, New Hampshire for your help.

Were you able to open the other files that I sent you last night on the Prescott family?

I have CC'ed JR Stockwell and Sandy, a new friend and Registrar at DAR. I had sent you some documents on our ancestor, Jonathan Prescott III, A Patriot of the American Revolution and a former resident of Gilmanton in 1794 and who died there on December 10, 1809.

I have provided you a condensed version of the Prescott Memorial, A Genealogical Memoir of the Prescott Families in America. Written by William Prescott, M.D. in 1870. The original version is available online but the file size is 54MB and much too large to send by email.

This information provides the history of the family origins from Lancashire and Dryby, Lincolnshire, England. Part 1 discusses the Prescott Branch that immigrated to the Massachusetts Bay Colony and our ancestor, the first Prescott family member in New Hampshire, James Prescott which is part 2 of this Prescott genealogical memoir.

Many of the Prescott descendants in New Hampshire can trace their roots back to James Prescott. Our Jonathan Prescott ancestor does go back to him.

The Prescott family lived in the following communities on the seacoast, Kingston, Hampton, Hampton Falls and Kensington, NH.

Our American Patriot ancestor, Jonathan Prescott traveled up to Gilmanton from Kensington, NH and brought family along with him. As we have discussed, the family members within Gilmanton, NH that I was able to find are all located at the Smith Meeting House Cemetery, in Gilmanton.

I hope you find this document interesting and helpful to add to the Prescott file in Gilmanton. Please reach out to me if you and the other Cemetery Trustees find any rediscovered information on the Prescott family members within your historic archives and records in beautiful Gilmanton, New Hampshire.

Thank you for the documents! I don't know how fast Fred will respond, but I expect that he will.

We have the records (such as they are) for every one of the 31 cemeteries under our care and checked what we have when we responded.

There are two private cemeteries, Smith Meetinghouse and Pine Grove. I don't have full records for either. You've contacted Fred and what I do have on Pine Grove, shows the earliest burial as 1827.

The early Smith Meetinghouse church records did show references to old Mr. Prescott and to Rachel Ladd Prescott. But no death or burial info.

Belmont, NH was a part of Gilmanton until 1854. So I had also checked what I have of their records. The contact for Belmont cemeteries is Sharon Ciampi, [REDACTED].

The only pre-1900 Prescott burials that show in our records:

Mudgett Cemetery-Anna Healy 1841, Samuel 1836
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I will try to access the Town Clerk's records. Her office was actually closed for almost a month this year and is only open part-time now. But I'll contact her and see what I can do.

Candace,

I was very happy to receive your email this afternoon and I am so grateful for your time and willingness to help us with the search for our patriot ancestor, Jonathan III Prescott.

I know you are leaving no stone unturned. I too continue my research to solve the mystery. Jonathan and his wife, Rachel Clifford Prescott had several children. Lucy, died in 2 years, buried in Kensington, NH, Rachel, who married J Bachelder, buried in Vermont, Sarah who married a Tilton, buried in Sandown, NH, Judith who married a Hubbard, buried in Sandwich, NH, Jonathan IV, buried in Gilmanton, Samuel, buried in Gilmanton and Timothy, buried in Gilmanton. I found his sons, mentioned above and they are buried at SMHC together in a row in the old section of the cemetery.

I researched the burials of all his children thinking it may present a clue to where he and his wife Rachel would lay to rest, staying with family. The common theme still points to Gilmanton where he moved with his sons to Gilmanton and all his sons are buried in Gilmanton. His daughters were much older and died in different areas of the state and one daughter in Vermont.

The records show Jonathan died in December 10, 1809, a short time later his son Jonathan IV died. They both served the N.H. Regiment in the American Revolution and I found a muster roll that has their signatures Jonathan Prescott and Jonathan Prescott Jr., father and son together.

Although they were born in the Kensington and Hampton Falls area of New Hampshire, it is a marvelous part of history to have found them moving to Gilmanton, American Patriots! It is my mother's maternal line where the Blake family, the Rundlett family, the Clough Family and the Prescott family linked together (Meredith, Belmont, Gilmanton and Canterbury).

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
