

### County Sports Shrewsbury and Clinton Youngsters Play to 0-0 Tie

CLINTON, Nov. 16.—The Clinton-Shrewsbury Freshman-Sophomore teams met in an undergraduate test game today at the High School field here, playing to a scoreless standoff. Shrewsbury threatened twice, losing the ball on downs at the 5-yard line in the first period and ending the game at the 9-yard marker, while the closest Clinton was able to approach to the defenders' goal line was in the third period, when the team marched 50 yards to the 25 before being stopped.

The game was of four eight-minute periods. The local boys played their usual brand of snappy ball with triple passes and double reverses behind the line of scrimmage, but in the shadow of the Shrewsbury goal posts superior line power prevented a score.
