GILMANTON — Donald Ralph Jenkins, 85, died at his home in Gilmanton Iron Works on Jan. 17, 2009, after a brief illness.

He was born in New Brunswick, N.J., on May 1, 1923, to Ralph A. and Rachel (Osborne) Jenkins. He graduated from Rutgers University and Lehigh University with degrees in mechanical engineering.

During World War II he served in the Army Air Corps in the European Theater as a first lieutenant (navigator on a B24 Liberator bomber). He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters.

For 40 years, he taught mechanical engineering, 34 of them at Lafayette College in Easton, Pa., as an associate professor. He spent many of his formative years on Crystal Lake in Gilmanton Iron Works and retired there in 1987.

He was a member of the First Congregational Church in Pittsfield and the Winnipesaukee Lodge 75 FA&M.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 61 years Lavinia (Burns) Jenkins: his daughters, Winnie and her husband, Richard Ru-
