Keystone Veterans Project

In 2013 the Members of Auxiliary Unit #102 realized the need to establish a repository of records identifying veteran burials in the community.

Each year, the American Legion places an American Flag at the grave of all such known gravesites.

However, the existing list of known burials is incomplete.

All Veterans should receive the honor of recognition for their service and this honor should extend to their final resting place.

Therefore, this keystone project for the Ellis-Geddes-Levitt American Legion Auxiliary Unit #102 is envisioned to create a written record of Veteran Gravesites in Gilmanton.

There is no one source of such information and we are seeking the help of the community as well as family and friends of departed Veterans.

Help us create the record necessary to continue to honor the Veterans that have served our Country.

Gilmanton Cemeteries



There are 36 known burial grounds and cemeteries within the Town of Gilmanton.

Because of the historic nature of such sites, many gravestones are no longer readable; some have been removed over the decades and centuries; and many were buried without having a permanent engraved marker.

Very few burial records survive from early interments and in very few cases does the record indicate military service.

Although searching these sites is one way of obtaining information, it is certainly not the single, most useful method.

How Can You Help?

The community, itself, holds the knowledge that will make this project a success.

We are asking that you share information with us on Veterans buried in Gilmanton. This would be recent and older burials because even recent events may not be recorded.

We have a list of burials that we are aware of. The list will be showcased at the Old Home Day and other events we attend. We are also working to get it up on the web.

Meanwhile, all of our contact info is included here. Please do not hesitate to let us know whatever info you may have and to inquire if we already have a name on the list.

We are hoping to obtain name, burial location, military branch, rank, unit, dates of birth and death and any additional information you may be able to provide.
