Church Acts.

At a Church meeting held February 13 1776 after opening the Meeting by prayer the Church proceeded to make choice of 2 deacons. Mr. Stephen Dudley was chosen first Mr. John Sanborn said Deacon by ye universal suffrage of all ye male members to stand on trial till ye Lecture before ye first Sacrament in April & then to give in their answer whether they accepted or not. The Church further agreed upon Eliphelit Gilman, Samuel Dudley, Jacob Kelley and Woodbridge Dean to be our Quinster to tune the violin; also for each member of the Church to contribute nine pence a piece for the purpose of supplying ye Communion table with Eliments for the year ensuing more over for each male member to contribute one chilling per man to purchase a Church book of records.

After both Lectures in April and May the Deacon elect on being requested to give in their answers desired longer time for consideration and it was granted them.

At our preparatory Lecture September. 2: 1779 the Deacons above elected came to a full determination and in the presence of the Church accepted of their Election & agreed & consented to officiate in the office & to serve God in his Church faithfully as becometh deacons may ye Lord help them thus to do & so to purchase to themselves a good degree and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ. May 3: 1781 the Church being together after the exercises voted that we would receive into the Church and ~~in being~~ to the participation of the Lords supper altho they do not thro some in their mind bring their children to the ordinance of Baptism.

November 3: 1786

At a Church meeting appointed for the purpose of taking into consideration the withdraw of three members from our communion viz Mr. David Fifield, Mr. Jonathan Hutchins and his wife Theodate.

The Church entered first on the consideration of Mr. Fifields case, and passed the following votes 1 That as the said Fifield tho seasonably notified to appear at this meeting is not present to speak for himself it would be improper to pass a public answer upon him without granting him another opportunity and that therefore this meeting be adjourned to the first thursday in December next for that purpose 2 that it is the earnest request of the members of this Church that Mr. Fifield appear personally at the adjournment and give the reasons if any he has of his withdraw to his Brethren- 3 that Gen Joseph Badger & Capt Nathaniel Wilson be a Committee to carry the above vote of the Church to Mr. Fifield-converse with him and endeavor to bring him to a compliance with the churchs request & make return at the adjournment.

Secondly the Church entered on the consideration of the case of Mr. Hutchins and his wife and voted that Deacon Stephen Dudley and Mr. Ebenezer Page be a Committee to deal with them in Private & press them by all proper scriptural arguments to comply with their Duty & make return at the adjournment.

The Church met according to adjournment Thursday December 7th::1786.

The meeting was opened by prayer the former votes of the Church were read the Committes report that they had dealt with the delinquent members as appointed Mr. Hutchins did not appear tho desired by the Committee to give the reasons of his withdraw to the Church.

Mr. David Fifield appeared and gave the reasons of his withdraw to the Church which were as follows

1 Because the Baptist were not allowed to pray and exhort in our meeting house when under an impulse of the Spirit this he looked upon as bringing death on the church.

2 Because David Beans Wife a Sister in the church had some years ago accused him of stealing and wronged him latterly many instances and therefore he cannot sit with her at the Lords table.

3 that the new way of singing in our meetings is disagreeable & unsatisfactory to him

4 That some Doctrines held to by some of the members of the church and at times preached in public are contrary to his way of thinking for the above reasons he looks upon his withdraw as justiable & unblameable.

The church not having time to consider the validity of his reasons voted as follows

1 That this Meeting be adjourned to the first Thursday of January next at 1 of ye clock P.M. to consider and judge of the case.

2 That the two Deacons, Deacon Dudley and Deacon Sanborn be a Committee to converse with Mr. Hutchins and his wife and request their attendance at the next meeting and make report to the Church at the adjournment.

Thursday

The church met according to adjournment, January 4th 1787.

The meeting was opened by prayer the former votes were read, the Committee appointed to deal with Mr. Hutchins and his wife report that they had conversed with them and found that the reason why Mrs. Hutchins had not attended our communion the season past was not fer throu disaffection with the Church or any member of it but for want of health ability & incapable in a judgment of charity Mr Hutchins appeared personally and being asked the reasons of his withdraw gave them as follows 1 that some words

spoken by General Badger had given him some offence. 2 That the 14
new mood of singing without reading was disagreeable because he
could not understand the sence of the words, after some conver-
sation of the members present on these reasons and Mr Hutchins
manifesting a desire of longer time of consideration, the church
unanimously granted that he should have till the next lecture to
think of the matter & then to give a decisiva answer whether he
will return to his duty yea or nay-

Mr. Fifield also appeared and after some further conversation
with him the church not being ripe for a judgment of his case
agreed to put it of till the adjournment for further consideration
Lastly voted that this meeting be adjourned for the purpose above
mentioned to the last thursday in March next at 3 oclock p.m.

The Church met according to adjournment the last thursday
in March as above and the two members above mentioned not being
present it was thought advisable to adjourn this church meeting
till the next lecture in May and it was accordingly adjourned
till June, The Church met according to adjournment Mr Hutchinson
appeared and in a passion suddenly left the house. Voted that Mr.
Page & Deacon Dudley be a committee to talk still further with
Mr. Hutchins cool him down & bring him to sense of duty also
that the same men be a committee to deal further with Mr. David
Fifield and make report at the next meeting Voted that this
meeting be adjourned to next Lecture August. at the same meeting
it was voted to excuse Deacon Sanborn at present from officiating
in the office of Deacon on account of some difficulties subsist-
ing in his own mind.

The Church met according to adjournment thursday November I,
1787 Mr. David Fifield one of the persons dealt with appeared
confessed his fault in withdrawing asked the forgiveness of the
church & promised to attend regularly for the future. The Church
gladly received him & unanimously voted that he should be restored

to our communion again Mr. Jonathan Hutchinson did not appear. The Church having taken into prior consideration on his unchristian conduct his incommensurable behavior voted that he should be confined therefore and that a writing should be drawn up by the minister setting forth his inminality and when approved of by the church put to him by the hands of a committee chosen for that purpose. Lastly voted that this meeting be adjourned to the first thursday in December for the purpose above mentioned.

The Church met according to adjournment and after hearing the paper above mentioned read voted to approve of it and also to send it to Mr. Hutchins by the hands of Deacon Stephen Dudley & Ebenezer Page as our Committee & then dissolved the meeting.

At a Church meeting October 3:1799 voted to send Deacon Dudley Benjamin Page & Doctor Smith as a Committee to deal with Samuel Osgood who ~~person~~ had been dealt with in a Private way for withdrawing from our communion & joining with the baptist and invite him to appear at our next meeting & give the reasons of his withdraw to the church

Met according to adjournment October 31:1799 Mr Osgood appeared & gave the reasons of his withdraw as follows 1 because he thought it wrong to pay ministers for preaching 2 because he thought some of the members of the Church were dead or destitute of true religion. These reasons were not thought sufficient to justify him. But as excommunication was the next step the church thought it not best to proceed to it, but to give him further time of consideration & accordingly adjourned the meeting till the lecture preceeding the first Sabbath in April next.

Met according to adjournment friday April 11th-1800 Mr. Osgood was not present being absent on account of a wound & lameness as we were informed by one of our members, it was therefore thought advisable to adjourn the meeting till the lecture previous to the

first sabbath in July next, Ebenezer Stevens & Jacob Kelley were chosen to give him notice of the meeting & also to deal with Cap. David Wifield who has absented himself from our meeting & communion of late & make report ag the Church meeting.

The Church also passed a vote to admit David Elsworth (upon the condition of his making a humble penitent confession upon the congregation of his great sin in breaking the seventh command) the occasional communion which he according^{ly} did & was received.

The church also passed a vote unanimously to admit his wife being a baptist a member of Mr Smith Church of Haverhill to occasional communion & like wise any other baptist person in good standing who belong to regular churches in their own order, who may be present at our communion & do desire the same.

Met according to adjournment July 3d:1800 Samuel Osgood & David Wifield appeared before the church & gave the reasons of their withdraw as follows 1 because they did not like some Doctrine preached by the minister & held by the church particularly the Doctrine of Election & Spiritual grace in the conversion of sinners 2 That preaching by notes was offensive to them & writing of sermons. 3 that supporting ministers by a fixed salary was wrong. 4 that it was wrong for the worlds people to lead in the singing of gods precepts, none but believers should sing. 5 that it was offensive for the minister to pray at the Academy on exhibition days.

6 That the people attending this meeting dressed to fine & followed the fashion of the world.

Lastly that there was not liberty for every one to pray & cohort in this meeting when they pleased & that was the reason of the deadness. On account of these things say they we cannot walk with you pull down the bars say they & become of our mind & we will return to you. As there was not time & opportunity for the church to deliberate & weigh the validity these reasons the meeting was

adjourned to the lecture previous to the first Sabbath in September next.

September 3:1800 this meeting was adjourned till the last lecture previous to the first Sabbath in November next by a vote of the church.

The Church met according to adjournment October 30th & after weighing & considering the reasons above alleged for their withdraw by our separating Brethren voted they were not satisfactory ~~animi contrad-venti~~ & agreed to send them a written admonition & voted that Deacon Dudley Deacon Sanborn Doctor Smith & Mr. Benjamin Page be a committee to join the minister in drawing up & sending said admonition to the absenting brethen & then dissolve the meeting.

Which admonition was accordingly drawn up & approved by the whole Church December following on the Lords day & sent by the committee to the absenting Brethen

February 15th 1802

Complaint being made against Caleb James a member of this Church absenting himself from the communion of the Church during the whole of the last season & before more or less for the space of 2 or 3 years, I thought duty to take the mind of the Church respecting his conduct; they were accordingly desired to stop after meeting . His case was proposed & they voted unanimously that he ought to be dealt with for his delinquency, agreeably to this report a church meeting was appointed on Tuesday the 23 instant & 2 jurors chosen viz Benjamin Page and Micajah Kelley as a committee to notify Brother James of time & place & earnestly desire him to attend & give the reasons of his neglecting divine ordinances with us agreeably to his covenant vows- the weather being exceeding boisterous on said day, only 2 members with brother James attended the number being so small it was agreed that no-

thing could be done officially on his case, but that it might be¹⁸
proper to have some general conversation on the subject according-
ly he entered upon it.

I addressed myself to him, thus Brother James the Church have
for sometime been dissatisfied with your non attendance with them
on Sacrament days many view it as a breach of covenant & have ap-
pointed this day for you to give the reasons of your conduct. The
answer he gave was this, You no need to have appointed such a day
you know my reasons well enough before you are the man meaning the
minister who has given me offence I am not offended with the
Church as a body but you are the sole cause of my withdrawing. I
told him we did not know them as a body, if he had informed in-
dividuals yet the Church as a body were not acquainted with you,
his withdraw was a grievance to the whole & therefore his reasons
ought to be given to the whole & therefore we called the meet^{as}

well he says you are the man who has given me offence- I
am not offended with the Church as a body you are the sole cause
of my withdrawing. I asked him wherein he says in believing old
lying Moulton & disbelieving me I told him (that in an affair of
intempt when the best of men are apt to be partial in their own
Moulton's favor) I had no right to believe either side without proper evi-
dence & I thought I acted right to suspend my judgment till this
evidence appeared-no he says you ought to have believed what I said
& rejected Moulton, but you know him to be a bad man I told him ad-
mitting him to be a bad man that was no reason why he should not
have a hearing & having justice done him provided he had been
wronged- well he says you never had any business with it in the
Church- I told him we never had it in the Church as a matter of
proper discipline- nor was ever any record made of it, that the
whole of our interference was a pacific mediation between him &
Mr. Moulton that as Moulton accused him of cheating him out of
20 dollars in a certain Note & blamed both minister & church for

keeping so bad a man in it I felt duty bound for the honor of religion for the purity & edification of the Church, & for the peace & happiness of the parties to strive profitable to compromise the matter in dispute accordingly, I tried first myself alone to get them to leave it out to referees mutually chosen Mr. Moulton chose one & Mr. James another some objection was made by Mr. Moulton against Mr. James choice not against the man but the great difference of & the great expense of his attendance & Mr. James was advised to choose one in the vicinity, immediately upon this Mr. James in a great passion left the room & the matter was at an end-upon this I proposed to them both to take the advice of the Church. On a lecture day they both agreed to it, & earnestly proposed that to the church not as a matter of discipline on which they had a right to pass a judgment but merely & only as a matter of council- they agreed with me that it was best for them to leave it to reference- accordingly with a great deal of persuasion they got them agreed to leave it to Edgar Parker decision to meet together on such a particular day the winter following-Mr. Moulton did not attend-Mr. James attended & acquired a paper with Mr. Moultons signature respecting the settlement of the same note in dispute, which paper was presented to the Church on a lecture day & tho Mr. Moulton denied his signature yet by comparing it with other papers containing his hand writing we were all satisfied that Mr. Moulton signed it- accordingly were satisfied that the note in dispute was settled, & that Mr. James moral character stood fair in that respect, so that there was now a regular church meeting about the affair from first to last- all the interference of the church was that of simply mediation & we all felt happy (at the time) that it was attended with such success in removing the ground of complaint & verily thought the matter was entirely settled & done with on Mr. James part, & that he thought so in as

much as he attended the worship of God & the Sacrament sometime after with us.

Upon this representation of the State of facts Mr. James answers, you had never any business with the case in no sense in the Church till it had gone thro a regular course of Law. I told him I would meet him upon that ground, the note in dispute had gone thro a course of Law & the creditor complained that by his means he was cheated out of 20 Dollars so that according to his own conception, the Church had a right to take it up as they did & ever more to have made it a matter of proper decipline that he ought to be thankful we were so much concerned about clearing up his character when impeached & that it terminated so happily in his favor. The answer he made was that he was able to vindicate his own character against Moulton any day & that he had no business with him- I told him that as a minister of the Church I had business with the moral character of all its members that when complaints were brought against any it was my duty to hear them & if worthy of notice to take all proper steps for settlement that I was by office a peace maker & it was my duty to endeavor to make peace between contending parties. Mr. James says Moulton was not a Church member & you ought not to have paid any attention to his complaints- I told him that I had ever made it my practice to hear complaints from those who are without as well as those within that Church members ought to have a good report not only among themselves but among others not of the body & as the apostle intimates that therefor I thought I did right in hearing the allegation against him & taking the measures I did to make peace he answered you never had any business to meddle with it & I dispise your conduct & treatment of me from first to last in this affair- this he repeated 2 or 3 times with great vehemence coming toward me & locking me up in the face apparently with a great deal of

venon I told him I was surprised to see such temper & asked him if that was the temper of the Lamb & Dove so often recommended by our Savior to his followers & told him that living and dying in that temper he never could be happy that I had never designed him any ill treatment that if I had sinned against him it was a sin of ignorance that ought at least somewhat to mitigate the criminality & influence him to kindness- the answer he made was I never will settle it without your humble confession of your abusive treatment of me. I told him I was ready to make that confession whenever he should make it appear that I had done him wrong-You have done me wrong he says in trying to get away my interest for Moulton you would all have been well perhaps if I had gone & paid Moulton 40 Dollars unjustly. I told him that was certainly an unjust charge as for myself I wished for nothing but justice & I did not believe the Church wished to have him wronged out of a copper- well he said it should never be settled in this world without you will humbly confess your fault to me-I told him as to making such confession I could not without being made of criminality but was willing to leave it to the church to determine the matter whether I had wronged him or not-The answer he made was-I had as full as lieve, leave it to yourself to determine it as to the Church for they will say just as you say right or wrong. I told him I was astonished to hear such a hard answer of all his Brethren come out of his mouth that carried the idea that they were all a pack of villains combined to join with the minister to carry a point the never so bad. The answer he made was, I am not affraid of any of you, do your best or worst I told him it appeared evident enough he was not affraid- he was not affraid to speak evil of Dignities nor was he affraid to injure his brethren in a most rash manner-What Dignities he says have I spoken evil of- I told him that ministers were sent by Christ they were his ambassadors & as such were

highly to & that he had vilified me in such a manner as I had never been before the answer he made was as a preacher of the Gospel I have nothing against you-but your lordnit in this affair. I dispise it- I told him I did not desire to be my own judge in the case or confine the judgment of it wholly to the Church but was willing to refer it to a council of ministers, Deacons or any other good men & if they brought me in culpable I would make the confession laid upon me. He answered I will leave it to no body the ministers will say as you say-all I want of you is to give me a dismissal to the Church at Exeter & this I command you to deliver forthwith. I told him it was a singular way of asking for a dismissal in the style of a sovereign or king to his servants & savored of great pride & self sufficiency-but as to a dismissal he could not have one till he has settled the matter of his delinquency with the Church & then if they said he should have one I was ready to grant it- he answered if we would not give him one he would take it for leave us he would at any rate- I told him if he did break away by violence he would be doubly guilty-I in neglecting the Sacrament with us 2- in refusing to be subject to the discipline of Christ in this Church both of which he had solemnly promised when he entered into covenant- he answered he had broken no promise, the covenant was then produced & the particular article read to him wherein he had made that engagement: he answered that Churches had no business to have such covenants-I told him that it was the practice of Gods people formerly to have written covenants to show how they understood the scripture & to point out to them their duty- & every man who was honestly willing in his heart to do his duty- was willing to be bound to do it- & if he did not do it would be willing to be discipline- he still stood to it that he had broken no obligation & appealed to the Searcher of hearts to avough his innocency & retorted to his old argument you

are the whole cause of my absenting from the communion if there is any blame it must lay at your door. I told him admitting I had done wrong it was no cause for him to do wrong that my sin was no cause for his disobedience in that case it was his duty to have dealt with me according to the rules of Christ in Mat. 18~~2~~ he then wished that he had not taken the steps of ye Gospel & was in that respect to blame- he further confessed that his mind had been in a state of war against me for 4 or 5 years- that he had never gone away from any house so wounded in his feelings as from mine I told him that I was not conscious of giving him any just occasion for hard thoughts, it was true I had reproved him for running about from house to house without any steady occupation as what I thought inconsistent with the christian character & for attempting to preach without a proper call or qualification & in both respects has given him all the good advice I could as a christian brother as I was in duty bound so to do & as to his carrying on war against me in his mind for 5 years it was a wickedness in only of his own making a bitter root of his own reflection & he ought to know that I had never had any war in my mind against him, I had been wounded several times by his unchristian temper but never fastened any resentments against him but was ready to forgive upon the least sign of repentance. After this conversation it was proposed to adjourn the meeting -we told Mr. James we would use all possible lenity & candor toward him-He should appoint his own day where he would meet the Church & we would conform to it on the whole he utterly refused to appoint a day or to make any promise to attend the Church meeting-but called for a Letter of admonition immediately such a one as Capt Fifield had- I told him it was not in my power to give him such a one till his case was fairly tried & judgment was gone against him & exhorted him by all means to see his Brethren all together & perhaps matters

might be compromised- he intimated that he cared nothing about them they were all against him & he wished never to have any thing more to do with them as long as he lived- I asked him whether he did not think some of them would go to heaven & how could he live with them forever in heaven if he could not bear with them on earth- he intimated that there must be a great alteration in him & them too before they got to heaven & again insisted hard upon a letter of admonition & said he did not care how black it was; we might make it as black as we pleased with the catalogue of his crimes, & intimated it was not in our power to do him any harm. I told him I was sorry to see such a temper & intreated him to set a day to meet us. The brethren present used every argument to persuade him to no purpose- we then appointed the 1 day of April at the lecture & adjourned the meeting till said day & notified him to attend- & make his defense before the Church.

Met according to adjournment April 1-1802 Mr. James attended & made his humble acknowledgment for his past neglect of duty & unchristian conduct toward Mr. Smith & the Church & received their forgiveness & was restored to his former standing & fellowship Amen.

November 7th the Church appointed Mr. Benjamin Page & Mr. Ebenezer Stevens a committee to deal with Maria Bradly & the wife of Samuel French of Loudon & report & appointed a Church meeting to hear the report thursday the 2 of December.

The Church met according to appointment Decm 2d. the committee reported that the reason why Mrs. French had not attended was some misunderstanding with her brother Ezekiel French but upon their coming together face to face the misunderstanding was removed, the difficulty healed & she was determined to attend her duty for the future and that the reason Mrs. Bradly gave for her neglect was her own unworthiness but this not being satisfactory to the Church it

was agreed she should be labored with further & Deacon Dudley with the Pastor was added to the former Committee to deal with her- and the Church meeting was adjourned to Deacon Dudleys thursday the 30th of December- The Church met according to adjournment the Committee not being called upon no report was exhibited, but as they had it in contemplation to choo^{se} a new Deacon & the number being small & not being prepared to vote the meeting was adjourned to the 2 thursday in March for that purpose & to hear the report of the Committee.

The 2 thursday being town meeting the Church meeting was adjourned to the Tuesday following being the 15th day of the month the report of the committee was that ^{Mrs.}Bradly had promised to return to her duty- The Church proceeded to consider the expediency of having two Deacons chosen at this time as the other two were old & almost past officiating in that office.

Voted 1 that it would be expedient to make choice of two at this time.

Voted 2 that Mr. Winslow Page be the first Deacon on trial.

Voted 3 that Mr. Jacob Kelley be the second Deacon on trial.

Voted 4 that they have the matter under serious consideration till the lecture preceding the first Sabbath in July & that this meeting be adjourned to that day for them then to give in their answer whether they accept or no.

Met according to adjournment Jul 2d. the Deacons elect declined accepting the officiat present but were willing if the Church desired to still continue on probation till the Lecture preceding the first Sabbath in September. The meeting was accordingly adjourned till that day for that purpose when they are to give a decisive answer & in the meantime the Church are to have some other persons in view to be chosen at that time as Deacons in case the persons above mentioned should give a negative answer.

Met according to adjournment September 2d 1803 Mr. Winslow Page accepted the office of Deacon & is to officiate accordingly may the Lord aid & assist him to be faithful man until death. Mr. Jacob Kelley did not accept ^{to} the satisfaction of the Church & accordingly returned to the body as a private member- the time being short the meeting was adjourned till Friday September 30th at the Lecture for the purpose of making choice of another Deacon.

Met according to adjournment Sep. 30th the number being small & not prepared for choice it was adjourned till the November lecture.

Met according to adjournment Nov 4th and proceeded to make choice of a Deacon by Ballot.

Mr. Benjamin Page was chosen and desired time of consideration the meeting was accordingly adjourned till the first conference in January next then to give his answer whether he accepted or not.

Met according to adjournment January 13-1804 when Mr. Benjamin Page gave in his acceptance of the office of a Deacon in this Church may he use the office well.

At a meeting of the Church after Lecture October 5th-1804.

Voted that the thanks of this Church be given to Thomas Cogswell Esqr. for his generous donation of Seventy five dollars for the purpose of purchasing Sacramental vessels for the use of this Church also that the Donor be consulted on to the kind of vessels he would wish to have purchased and that a copy of this resolve be presented to the Donor.

At the Lecture previous to the first Sabbath in April 1806. it was moved that two members be dealt with for Disorderly conduct viz Mrs. Mariah Bradly for a total neglect of attending Sacramental occasions & Salim Cogswell for breach of covenant in departing from this Church without leave & joining another of another denomination & getting himself rebaptized contrary to

the rules of the Gospel & a Church meeting was accordingly appointed on the 2 of May immediately after the Lecture for the purpose of dealing with those persons according to the rules of the Gospel & Deacon Winslow Page & Cap. Nathaniel Wilson were appointed a committee to cite them to appear before the Church & give their reasons if any they have for their conduct & the Church meeting was adjourned to the Lecture previous to the first Sabbath in June. Met according to adjournment May 30th and the Committee reported that Mrs. Bradly did not incline to return to her duty. But wished the Church would dismiss her to the world or let her alone & Salim appeared & wished we would let him alone to go where he pleased where he might breath a freer air & enjoy himself but did not appear to be the least humble or sensible that he had done any wrong he said- he had done no wrong in breaking covenant.

There not being time for the Church to bring in their judgment the meeting was adjourned till the Lecture preceeding the first Sabbath in July- When the Church met according to adjournment to when the matter was debated upon the members were unanimous in the opinion that he had done wrong- but were not willing to pass the sentence upon him of excommunication, at least some members were not willing till some further labour with him to bring him to a sense of his criminality accordingly 2 months were allowed them to labour with him & the meeting was adjourned till the Lecture previous to the first Sabbath in September.

Then adjourned to the Lecture previous to the first Sabbath in October on account of the absence of a number of the members Met according to adjournment October 3-1806 & voted that a written admonition be sent to Maria Bradly by some members of the Church.

At the request of two members of the Church viz Jacob & Micajah Kelley. 2 Voted that this meeting be adjourned till the

Lecture previous to the first Sabbath in May next in order to give Salim further time of consideration.

Met according to adjournment, & on account of the absence of some members adjourned to the Lecture previous to the first Sabbath in June, met according to adjournment & there being no prospect of Salim returning to his duty according to the report of those who had conversed with him, Voted 1 that he had done wrong in breaking covenant with his Brethren 2 that a letter of admonition be sent to him for the same & 3 Voted to adjourn the meeting till the Lecture preceeding the first Sabbath in July next.

Met according to adjournment & heard the letters of admonition read that had been written by our Pastor to send to Mrs. Bradly and Salim I. Voted to approve of said letters & that they should be sent by the hands of a Committee to them 2 that the 2 Deacons Benjamin Page & Winslow Page & Doctor William Smith be a committee for that purpose & 3 voted to dissolve the meeting.

Friday May 5-1809 the Church was desired to stop after the Lecture to take into consideration the case of Mr. William Garland one of the members being accused by the reports of many that he was guilty of adultery with Nancy Garman & was the father of her bastard child then born & had given notes for the maintenance of ssid child. The church thought we ought not to suffer him or ourselves to lay under the scandal of it but to use all proper means to have it showed up if guilty that he might be brought to repentance if innocent that it might be made manifest, accordingly a meeting of the Church was appointed on Friday the 2 of June after the Lecture for the purpose & a committee appointed viz Deacon Benjamin Page Doctor William Smith & Mr. John Dudley to wait upon Mr. Garland & notify him of said meeting & request him to attend & bring forward his evidence to clear up his character if he could & the Church.

would bring forward their evidences & have a fair trial of this case.

Friday June 2-1809 the Church met, according to appointment- The Committee reported that they had waited upon Mr. Garland in pursuance of their appointment & requested his attendance as above stated, that he solemnly protested his innocency of the charge & that he would attend at time & place agreeable to the request of his Brethren unless something extraordinary should happen this report was read publickly by them proceeded to business I Doctor Simon Foster was chosen occasional Clerk for this meeting & as Mr. Garland was absent & not likely to be present at all at this time on account of the sickness of his father the Church thought best notwithstanding to proceed to the examination of witnesses on account of the difficulty of getting them together again & besides as Mr. Garland had not made manifest any desire to have the examination postponed on account of his absence the Church thought they had a good right to proceed & accordingly voted in the 2 places to proceed to the examination of witnesses the names were then called over.

Doctor Simon Foster

Mrs. Burley

Mrs. Pulsifer who were with the girl in her travail

Mr. Nathaniel Shannon & his wife Mrs. Shannon

Cap. Daniel Moulton

Mr. Theophilis Sanborn

Mr. William Smith junior

who severally & particularly gave in their testimony as follows.

I Doctor Simon Foster testifies that on the 3d. of April last I was called to attend on Nancy Carman who I found in travail & on the most Solemn examination she declared that William Garland was the Father of the child she was then in travail with & no

other person & this she declared several times under the Solemnity of an oath as she thought I had a right to administer one.

Mrs. Burley testified that she was Present at the time viz the 3d of April 1809 & heard Nancy Garman declare that William Garland was the father of the child she was then in travail with & no other man

Mrs. Pulsifer testified that she was present on the 3d of last April above mentioned & heard Nancy Garman declare that the child she was then in travail with was William Garland & nobody else as above testified by the other two witnesses.

Nathaniel Shannon testified that William Garland was at his house on the 4th day of April last the day after Nancy Garmans child was born & gave a note to Ebenezer Garman of one hundred Dollars for the sole purpose of maintaining Nancy Garmans child.

Nathaniel Shannon further testified that the above mentioned William Garland did sometime prior to the best of his remembrance about the 7th of last March give Ebenezer Garman a fifty Dollar note as a part of the compensation for the maintenance of the child & promised at the same time that if the child was born about the 6th of April following that he would give more & further security which he did when he gave the hundred Dollar note above mentioned-

Nathaniel Shannon further testified that he understood that the above fifty dollar note was given up to William Garland upon the condition of his giving better security or getting a bondsman for the hundred Dollar note which was afterwards done as I understood by his Brother Samuel Carland stepping in & signing with him three notes of twenty five Dollars each to be paid to Ebenezer Garman in the lieu of the hundred Dollar note above mentioned given for the maintenance of Nancy Garmans child-

Mrs. Shannon testifies that on the 7th day of April last

past William Garland was at their house & she presented the child above mentioned to him; when he said it was a well looking child- and she further testifies that she understood & believed that William Garland did at the same time give a note to her Brother Ebenezer Garman of one hundred Dollars for the maintenance of the child of Nancy Garmans.

Cap. Daniel Moulton testifies that sometime in April last Ebenezer Garman & Major David Sanborn were at his house- & began a conversation about the above unhappy affair. When Mr. Garman said he could not maintain his sisters child & wished me to assist him in getting better security & there produced three notes all signed by William Garland- one for fifty dollars Dated March 7th 1809 one of one hundred Dollars dated April 4th-1809 & one for about eight Dollars dated sometime last fall- & Major Sanborn & I examined them critically to see if there were any marks of forgery but we could find none- on the whole it appeared to us that the notes were all signed by one hand & pen they compared so exactly.

Mr. Theophilus Sanborn testifies that sometime last April when Mr. Nathaniel Shannon was at his house & in conversation about William Garlands giving a hundred Dollar note for the maintenance of Nancy Garmans child I told him I did not believe anything of it- he told me he would soon convince me of the truth of it & said Shannon went away & returned soon after with a hundred Dollar note & a small note of about eight Dollars both signed by William Garland in favor of Ebenezer Garman & I compared the signing & found it agreed very exactly indeed- so that I had no reason to believe that neither the one or the other was a piece of forgery

Mr. William Smith junior testifies that a shorttime since he was at the house of Mr. William Garland with Elder Buzzil-

who charged him very sharply with being guilty with Nancy Garman & being the real Father of her bastard child & exhorted him in a very earnest manner to confess it & ask forgiveness upon which Mr. Garland declared in the most solemn manner that he was altogether innocent of the crime alleged against him-he was asked why he gave a note or notes for the maintenance of the child if it was not his- he answered if there were any such note they were forged- & he would never pay them- upon which he was told that he ought to advertise in the public prints the forgery- he said he would if he could have a copy- upon which both Mr. Garland & his wife desired me to go & see the notes above mentioned & procure a copy of the date & sum upon which I went to Mr. Ebenezer Garman & he showed me a hundred Dollar note dated April 4th-1809 which I took a copy of & he also showed me an eight Dollar note, both signed William Garland- as nearly similar in all the letters as men generally write their names to notes- or any other instrument- the above copy I sent to Mr. William Garland by the hand of his Father & Mr. W. Garland promised me that he would immediately advertise the same in Concord paper. After the above testimonies were given as Mr. Garland was not present to defend himself & clear up his character being detained at home as charitably supposed thro the extreme illness of his Father the Church thought best to grant him another opportunity & accordingly voted that this meeting be adjourned till friday the 30th of June at 4 of the clock in the afternoon & that Mr. Garland be served with a copy of this vote & desired to attend at time & place.

The Church met according to adjournment. But Mr. Garlands Father still remaining extremely ill the Church thought best to adjourn the meeting till friday the 4th of August at 4 of the clock in the afternoon & that Deacon Dudley Deacon Benj. Page & Doctor Smith be a Committee to serve Mr. Garland with a copy of

this vote & to make report at the next meeting.

Met according adjourn August 4 & Mr. Garland not being Present it was thought best to give him another Solemn call to attend & accordingly voted to adjourn the meeting to Friday the 4th September & Deacon Page John Gilman & Dr. Smith were chosen a Committee to notify Mr. Garland by a written summons to attend at time & place

[The following text is extremely faint and largely illegible due to the quality of the scan. It appears to be a continuation of a meeting record or minutes, detailing the actions of the committee and the church members.]

Met according to adjournment Sept. 11th 1809

Mr. Garland presented himself before the Church & confessed that he had done wrong & wished to be forgiven we told him that such a general confession would not do that it might be particular as to the crime & publish before the congregation he then confessed that he had con criminal with Nancy Garmon but the child was not his he was asked how he came to give notes for the maintenance of the child if not his- he confessed that he had had to do with the girl & that he gave those notes to pay for his own criminality - We told him it was not our business absolutely to prove the child to be his-but to prove his criminality which was sufficiently done by many witnesses & now by his own mouth- he was asked whether he was willing to come forward & make a public confession before the congregation he said he did not feel right to do it or his heart was not yet humble enough to take such a step & indeed he thought the chief he said to be dragged out of him & upon his desiring further time of consideration it was granted him till the next lecture- Move adjournment till Friday Sep 29th met according to the adjournment Sep 29 But Mr. Garland not attending & having sent word by Doctor Smith that he was necessarily called another way. The meeting was adjourned again till the next lecture Nov. 3-1809.

Met according to adjournment Novem. 3-1809 Mr. Garland presented himself But being still embarrassed in his own mind about making a public confession of his crime before the Congregation & desiring a longer time of consideration the Church granted him till the 25 of December next the meeting was accordingly adjourned to Monday the 25 of December to meet at my house at one of the clock afternoon.

Met according to adjournment December 25 Mr. Garland presented himself & exhibiting some tenderness & manifesting a willing-

ness to make a public confession of his criminality-But not being willing to return to his duty as a member the Church could not ^{accept} accept it as satisfactory till he should return to duty-But upon his desiring a longer time to consider & seek after more light the Church granted him till the 30th of March 1810 & adjourned the meeting till that day being Sacramental lecture.

Met according to adjournment March 30th 1810 Mr. Garland attended & declaring his mind to be in the same dark unfitted state about returning to his duty & not wishing the Church to wait any longer upon him but to proceed to cut him off the Church on account of the smallness of the number present thought best to postpone the final decision till a more full meeting agreed to adjourn then made choice off.

Deacon Winslow Page & Mr. Ebenezer Stevens as a Committee to take care of the Churches property in the hands of Deacon Benjamin Page & take the security for the same it being a gift to the Church from Judge Cogswell for the purpose of furnishing vessels for the use of the Church also agreed that Mrs. Garland being a member should have her child baptized & then the meeting was declared to be adjourned till the first day of June.

Met according to adjournment June 1st-1810 Mr. Garland not appearing to give any satisfaction to the Church voted that he should be, that he should be cut off from the body and ~~consigned~~ for the sin of fornication, & also for deceiving and using every exertion to hide & cover his transgression for a long time together & also for obstinacy & unwillingness to return to his duty after unwearied labor used with him for that purpose to remove all objections & that a Letter of public admonition be prepared by our Pastor to be read publicly & sent to him for his reformation. Then voted that the Church would deal with Mr. John Bradberry for neglect of duty and male conduct & a committee was chosen for that purpose viz Mr. Micajah Kelley and Mr. John Gilman, & make report at the next meeting then adjourned the meeting till the next Lecture June 29th.

Met according to adjournment Mon June 29th the letter of admonition was read to the church & approved of voted that it should be read before the congregation next Sab. & Mr. John Gilman & Doctor Smith was chosen as a committee to present the letter to Mr. William Garland. The committee reported that Mr. John Bradberry gave them little or no satisfaction for his neglect of duty & carry little or no encouragement that he would ever attend to it, then voted that he should have a letter of admonition sent to him & that one should be draughted & presented to the Church at the next Lecture then adjourned the meeting till Friday August the 3d.

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This letter of admonition was draughted & accepted by the Church & sent to Mr. Bradberry & the Church meeting dissolved.

At a church meeting held September 4th-1812 Deacon Benjamin Page & Deacon Winslow Page & Benjamin Swain were chosen a committee to inspect the conduct of the members of the Church & make a report of all misdemeanor worthy of animadversion.

A Church meeting was appointed August 29, 1813 to take into consideration some misconduct of Jonathan Ross junior being charged with intemperance to be held September 2, 1813.

Met on said day Ross not appearing was adjourned to the lecture previous to the first Sabbath in October.

The Church met according to adjournment Mr. Ross appeared and made a humble confession for the sin of intemperance and was restored to the fellowship of the Church. The Church also voted at this meeting to provide a cushion for the pulpit, & a pair of large decent gravestones for Judge Cogswells grave, out of the money he gave to the Church & that Deacon Winslow Page & Ebenezer Stevens should be a committee to put this vote in execution. Also at this meeting Ezekiel French being accused of taking & haling in two loads of hay upon the Sabbath, made his appearance & confessed that he did it. But plead that it was a work of necessity-the Church voted unanimously that his plea was not satisfactory & then adjourned the meeting for one month or till friday previous to the 1st Sabbath in November to give him time to consider of the bad tendency of his covenant.

Met according to adjournment, the friday previous to the first Sabbath in November 1813. Mr. French appeared & rather hoping to have a little longer time of consideration upon the subject above mentioned the Church agreed to grant him time for this purpose till the friday previous to the first Sabbath in May, 1814-Accordingly the meeting was adjourned till said Day-met according to adjournment April 29th, 1814 & Mr. French not appearing, the meeting was again adjourned till the Lecture previous

to the 1st Sabbath in June & Doctor Smith & Ebenezer Stevens were appointed to notify & call upon Mr. French, to appear at said meeting- & also to call upon Mr. Elisha Sweatt who had been guilty of the same misdemeanor.

Met according to adjournment June 3d. 1814. Mr. French appeared & made confession for Breach of the Sabbath to the satisfaction of the church & was restored to communion- Mr. Sweatt did not appear but it was thought adviseable, that I should converse with him upon the subject & report to the Church. There upon the complaint of Mr. Dirgin a member against Daniel Gilman a member for abusive & profane language uttered before him & a number of others, The Church agreed to deal with him & adjourned the meeting till the next Lecture & choose Mr. Jacob & Micajah Kelley to notify him of the same & report to the Church.

Met according to adjournment July 1st upon my reporting to the Church, the humble temper Mr. Sweatt exhibited in conversation he was restored to the fellowship of the Church, on account of his misconduct on the Sabbath the Two Mr. Kelleys reported that Daniel Gilman, did not deny the crimes alleged against him, but that he had no heart to repent or make a confession & therefore did not see his way clear to attend the Church meeting. But rather wished that a longer space might be allowed him for repentance. The Church accordingly agreed to grant him 3 months & the meeting was adjourned till the 30th of September, a Lecture day previous to the Sacrament.

Met according to adjournment & Gilman not being present adjourned till the 4th of November & Gilman being gone into the army adjourned till Monday the 12th of December 5 weeks. At a Church meeting May 5th-1815 Deacon Winslow Page, Ebenezer Stevens & Micajah Kelley were chosen as a committee to labour with Daniel Gilman. On account of the charges of intemperance & profanity brought against him by Mr. Durgin & make report at the next meet-

ing, then adjourned till June 2 at Lecture. Also the same committee to labour with Mrs. Nelson for absenting herself from meeting. The Church met according to adjournment June 2d & Daniel Gilman attended but his accuser being absent it was thought advisable to adjourn the meeting till the next Lecture & notify the accuser to attend & the meeting was accordingly adjourned till June 30th.

Met according to adjournment June 30th & Daniel Gilman appearing & wishing for longer time of consideration it was granted & the meeting was adjourned for 3 months viz till the October lecture.

September 29th the Church met according to adjournment & Daniel Gilman not appearing his case was not decided, but put off till the next lecture, the Church choose Deacon Benjamin Page & Doctor William Smith, as a committee to deal with Ebenezer Stevens & request his attendance at the next lecture & give his reasons why he has withdrawn from the meeting & communion table for several months. Then the meeting was adjourned till November 9th at the Lecture.

Met according to adjournment Nov 3 and Daniel Gilman not appearing. But requesting to be cut off the Church accordingly by their unanimous vote cut him off & excommunicated him, desiring the Pastor to prepare a letter for that purpose & Mr. Stevens by reason of previous engagements could not attend. The meeting was accordingly adjourned for a fortnight. Met again November 17th, Mr. Stevens appeared & offered his reasons for absenting himself from the meeting & communion I because he was not fed by the public administration & he would not give his money for that which did not profit.

2 Mr. Smith preached to much upon the outside & not enough upon the inside.

3. That he preached that people should pay their honest

debts.

4 That he preached a sermon at the funeral of Thomas Burns & did not name Christ.

5 That he preached upon the wisemen presenting their gold to Christ drew an inference from that, the people should support the Gospel.

6 That, he carried the Doctrine of Election further than the Bible carried it.

7 That in administering the Sacraments he made use of the words do this in remembrance of me, whereas but one evangelist had so mentioned it.

8 That Mr. Smith met with people on the 4th of July & prayed with them & dined with them.

9 That he went to exhibitions & prayed on that occasion.

Then the admonition & excommunicating Letter to Daniel Gilman was read & approved by a vote of the Church & to be committed to Deacons Benjamin Page & Winslow Page to be delivered to Daniel Gilman. Then the Church meeting was adjourned till the Lecture previous to the first Sacrament in May 1816 in order to reflect upon the case of Mr. Ebenezer Stevens.

Met according to adjournment May 2, 1816. Several members objecting against passing a judgment because Mr. Stevens was not present the meeting was adjourned till the next Lecture & Deacon Winslow Page & John Gilman were chosen a committee to visit Mr. Stevens & give him an offer to appoint the time & place where he would meet the Church to confer upon the reasons of his withdraw & to report the answer to the Pastor who is to inform the Church at or before the next meeting.

Met as above stated at Deacon Benjamin Pages. Mr. Stevens gave in in conference much the same reasons of withdraw, as before only adding two more I that Mr. Smith had not gone ac-

According to Bible rule in dealing with him in leaving his gift at the altar & going & being reconciled to his Brother before he offered his gift & that he had done wrong in suing the town to recover the taxes they had distrained from him.

The Church met according to adjournment July 6th at the meeting house considered the merit of Mr. Stevens reasons he gave for his withdraw & every member except one gave his opinion that they were totally insufficient to justify his withdraw-But as that one member suggested that in conversation Mr. Stevens manifested a desire to see the Church together once more no vote of excommunication was taken but the meeting was adjourned 3 months till the lecture preceding the 1st Sabbath in October next. Then the meeting was adjourned till the Lecture preceding the first Sabbath in November.

Met according to adjournment but the members present being very small it was thought best to adjourn till the last Friday in November.

Met according to adjournment November 29-1816. The case of Mr. Stevens was debated & every member present gave his opinion decidedly against him, viewing the reasons he gave for his withdraw as totally insufficient to justify him & therefore it was the unanimous vote of the Church to send him a letter of admonition & that the Pastor should draught the letter & then the Church adjourned to meet again on the 4th Sabbath of December to hear the letter & send it to Mr. Stevens.

Met according to adjournment the letter was read to the members of the Church present approved by them sent to Mr. Stevens by the two Deacons. Then the meeting was dissolved amen.

At meeting of a majority of the members of the congregational Church June 28th 1817 for the purpose of organizing themselves in some suitable manner to transact any and all the business of the Church in future.

Voted. To choose a standing Moderator to regulate the present and future meetings and Deacon Winslow Page was made choice of.

2nd. Voted To choose a Clerk to make records of all business transacted. Doct. Wm. Smith was chosen; and Thomas H. Merrill for his assistant.

3rd. Voted To dismiss Sarah Moulton now Sarah Towle by her request from the Church of Christ in this place and to recommend her to the fellowship & communion of the Congregational Church of Christ in Winthrop.

4th. Voted To erect some suitable monument to the memory of our late Minister Revd. Isaac Smith, and to choose a committee to ascertain as near as possible the probable expense of said monument; three were chosen Viz. Dea. Benj. Page Jonathan Ross & Thomas H. Merrill-

5th Voted. To choose Lieut. John Dudley and Micajah Kelley as a committee to take the care of the Churches property now in the hands of Dea. Benj. Page, and take security for the same. Said property being a gift to the Church from Judge Cogswell deceased, for the purpose of purchasing vessels for the use of the Church.

6th. Voted to adjourn to Thursday the 24th July next.

By letters missive from the Church of Christ in Gilmanton were convened in ecclesiastical Council at the house of Captain Samuel B. French in said town on tuesday the eighth day of June Ano Domini 1819 the following churches by their pastors and Delegates viz. The Church of Christ in Jaffrey. Revd. Laban Answerth Pastor Brother Adonijah Howe Delegate, Church of Christ in Gorham Revd. Asa Rand Pastor Brother John T. Smith Delegate, Church of Christ in Concord Revd. Asa McFarland D.D. Pastor Brother Samuel Fletcher Delegate, Church of Christ in Northwood Deacon Simon Bacheldor Delegate Church of Christ in Chichester Rev. Josiah Carpenter Pastor, Deacon Micajah Morrill and Brother Enoch Tilton Delegates. Church of Christ in Epsom Rev. Jonathan Curtis Pastor Deacon Ira Sanborn and Deacon Samuel Morrill Delegates, Church of Christ in Sandbornton Revd. Abraham Bodwell Pastor Deacon Joseph Sandborn Delegate, Church of Christ in Pembroke Revd. Abraham Burnham Pastor Deacon Nathaniel Blood Delegate. Church of Christ in Canterbury Revd. William Patrick Pastor Deacon Joseph Ham and Brother Asa Foster Delegates Church of Christ in London Rev. Rev. Josiah Carpenter was chosen Moderator.

Rev. Nathaniel Wells was chosen Scribe. Then adjourned to the Hall of the Academy where the Council was opened with prayer by the Moderator.

The Council then attended to the proceedings of the Church and Society in this place in giving Mr. Luke A. Spofford a call to settle with them in the work of the gospel ministry. And his answer to the same also to the evidence of his regular standing as a member of the Church of Christ and his recommendation for the work of the ministry and improvement of the Churches.

They then came to the following resolve viz. Resolved that the papers exhibited before the council respecting the call of Mr. Spofford and his answer are regular and that the way is now prepared to proceed to his examination.

The council then proceeded accordingly to examine the candidate with respect to his doctrinal and experimental knowledge of divine things. After examination had

Resolved unanimously that this council is satisfied with the qualification of Mr. Luke A. Spofford and will proceed to set him apart to the work of the gospel ministry over this Church and people by ordination:- The public exercises to commence tomorrow morning at half past ten o'clock.

Voted that the public exercises be performed as follows: That the Rev. Asa McFarland make the introductory prayer that the Rev. Asa Rand preach the ordination sermon that the Rev. Josiah Carpenter make the consecrating prayer that the Rev. Laban Answorth give the charge that the Rev. Enoch Corser present the right hand of fellowship that the Rev. William Patrick make the concluding prayer.

Voted to adjourn untill nine oclock tomorrow morning then to meet at this place.

Voted that the foregoing minutes be excepted and read in public as the result of this Council. Voted to adjourn to meet at the house of Capt. Samuel B. French immediately after the public exercises.
