SCHOOL WARRANT
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Gilmanton qualified to vote in District Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the thirteenth day of March, 1965, at 2:00 p. m. o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the District.
6. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the District will vote to elect its School District Officers by an official ballot at its annual School District meeting.
10. If the vote on Article 9 is in the affirmative, to see if the District will vote to adopt the non-partisan ballot system, as provided in RSA 59:73, 79 to 86, for the election of School District officers under an article in the warrant for any annual or special meeting of the District.
11. To see if the District will vote to build an eight room school house, and will authorize and direct the Mod-

erator of the District to appoint a building committee of seven, to consist of the three members of the School Board and four additional persons chosen from all sections of the Town, said school building committee to decide upon the location of the school house, after appropriate public hearing and discussion thereof; to procure plans and specifications for the school house, subject to the approval of the School Board as provided by statute; to purchase this site and enter into the necessary building contract; and to oversee the building of the school house.

12. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$600.00) six hundred dollars for the use of the school building committee to secure written options on at least three potential sites for the new school building.

13. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the use of the school building committee to secure preliminary sketches, floor plans and estimates of the proposed eight room school house.

14. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred thirty-one thousand fifty dollars (\$231,050.00) for the purchase of a site for, and the building of, a new eight room school house, the same to be raised by a 20-year serial bond issue; and to accept 30% State aid on the bond issue principal payments, or any other income made available to the District for that purpose.

15. To see if the District will appropriate three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for an additional school teacher for that portion of the year deemed necessary on the completion of the new school building.

16. To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the completion of paving at the Corner School. This article will be withdrawn if Article 11 is passed.

ANNUAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

Town of Gilmanton

March 14, 1964

Gilmanton Corner School — Gilmanton, N. H.

Minutes of the Annual School District meeting held at the Gilmanton Corner School, Gilmanton Corner, New Hampshire.

Pursuant to the above warrant a meeting of the School District of Gilmanton was held at the time and place within mentioned.

Meeting called to order by the Moderator, Howard Osler, who read the warrant.

It was voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Howard Osler for Moderator, and as there were no other nominations, Howard Osler was declared elected Moderator for the coming year.

It was voted that Moderator cast one ballot for Florence Bordeau for Clerk, and as there were no other nominations, Florence Bordeau was declared elected Clerk.

Katherine Clairmont was declared elected a member of the school board for three years. (Checklist used) 171 votes cast, 100 votes for Mrs. Clairmont.

Sybil Bryant was declared a member of school board for two years. (Checklist used) 167 votes cast, Mrs. Bryant had 91 votes.

It was voted that Clerk cast one ballot for Florence Durgin for Treasurer, and as there were no other nominations, Florence Durgin was declared elected Treasurer for coming year.

It was voted the salaries of school district officers for the 1964-1965 school year shall be as follows: Chairman of School Board, \$75.00; 2 School Board members, \$60.00 each; School Treasurer, \$50.00; Truant Officer, \$50.00; Census, \$25.00; Clerk, \$5.00; 3 Auditors, \$5.00 each.

Murray Gilman read a report relative to work done by Gilmanton Special School Study Committee, report on file. Vote of thanks given for their work.

Taken care of by Town Auditors.

Voted to accept the budget of eighty-three thousand five hundred eighty-two dollars and eighty-three cents (\$83,582.83) as listed in the town report for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid together with other income, the school board to certify the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Motion lost on all parts of this article — (3 parts).

It was moved by Walter Senior, Jr., that it be the sense of this meeting that the time and place of each monthly meeting of the school board during 1964-1965 be published at least one week in advance of said meeting in at least one local paper.

It was suggested the salaries of teachers be printed in next year's report.

Resolved that it is the sense of this meeting that an article shall be included in next year's school district warrant to consider the election of school district officers by non-partisan ballot at Town Meeting in the same manner as all other town officers are elected.

A letter of appreciation to Mr. Fox (Superintendent of Schools for Union No. 59) was read by Mrs. Clairmont; also a letter of thanks and appreciation for the cooperation of the school board in its recent exhibition, Americanism in Our Schools, written by Cynthia Brown, President of American Legion Auxiliary, Ellis Geddes, Levitt Post 102, Department of New Hampshire.

Voted to adjourn.
